| Matthead (logo) | <p>The 'TNS' is logo of a student magazine which stands for, The National Students. The matthead is usually known as the 'Title' of the magazine. In regards to this specific magazine, they have used their branded logo as part of the biggest writing on the front cover. The writing is very big and bold allowing it to be the first visual information to be seen by its readers. As the background is a dark grey shade the producers have used a bright bold yellow black behind the matthead. This increases the notability of the matthead making more of its readers to remember it. The 'TNS' has been written all within capital letters, all being the same size and font. Having the same font style and size is something that its readers will remember it by. In regards to the generalisation of the colour scheme, the matthead matches incredibly with the rest of the design. Having the main text blue with a bold yellow box as its background, it matches with the other yellow coloured cover lines. This is the starting point the theme, matching both the main image and the cover lines is something this matthead is capable of doing. In my personal opinion I think that matthead is very basic in regards to not having specific effects or tools used on it. However, the business of the matthead enables the rest of the magazine to do more of the attention-grabbing. The title is something that sets off the front cover as a whole; it gives a beneficial trade mark for it. As a whole using the 'TNS' is going to be beneficial for its company as if it's readers are used to seeing this logo, they can then put this on any other products they sell. This would be put on products such as; posters, websites and other goods they might sell.</p> |
| Deadline | <p>There has been given no official deadline in regards to the visuals of the front cover. Conventionally most magazine companies would provide this information, whether it been positioned on the front cover, inside the magazine or on the back. It is important for the date to be provided, whether it's published monthly or weekly, as its readers will need to know whether the magazine they're reading is an old or new issue. As the magazine is not making an obvious statement to the actual date of the magazine, I then used the cover lines to help my understanding of the sort of time it will be published. By using the cover lines I saw that the 2011 is the date as it refers to the sub-titles available.</p> |
